I am pleased to present the Governors' Annual Report to Parents providing information on the academic year 2017-18. The students in Archbishop McGrath Catholic High School have achieved results to be proud of at GCSE and A level.

Year 13 students were highly aspirational with 62% of pupils receiving offers from Russell Group Universities. Amongst the many outstanding results were the performances of Morgan Phillips (A\*, A\*, A\*, A\*) and Georgina Taylor (A\*, A\*, A, A) who gained places in the University of Cambridge to study Natural Sciences and Theology respectively. Georgia Phillips (A\*, A, A, B) gained a place to study Medicine along with Carla Elipane (A, A, A, B), Eve Clark will go to study at the Royal Veterinary College. The choice of universities was wide ranging and Konstancja Preisner's results earned her an excellence scholarship at the University of Swansea.

We are immensely proud of every pupil. They have great character and I am sure they will achieve great things. It is amazing that once again over a third of results were at A grade and above. They have not just set the bar high in terms of examination performance but the service they have given our school community. They always have been ready to help others, showing compassion, love and gratitude. They all wholeheartedly deserve their successes and they are a credit to the school and their families. We look forward to hearing about the great impact that they will have on the world in the future

GCSE results were strong and we have achieved the best results in English and Mathematics that we have ever had. This has resulted in an 11% increase in the level 2+ which is the number of students achieving at least 5A\*-C including English and Mathematics.

There are stunning achievements not least from the 11% of pupils achieving at least 10A\*/A grades and there has been an 8.5% increase in the number of students achieving at least 5A\*/A.

Pupils not only got more qualifications than ever before but at the highest grades. An incredible 29% of pupils achieved at least 5 A\*/A grades.

The school has maintained a wide choice of subjects to meet the needs of our young people. Every pupil completed at least 5 qualifications and 90% sat at least 8 GCSEs. Every child in the school achieved a minimum of 6 GCSE equivalents with nearly 90% achieving 10 or more.

## **School Information**

Archbishop McGrath Catholic High School is a voluntary aided mixed 11-18 school in the Archdiocese of Cardiff. It serves the parishes of the Bridgend Deanery. It was established just over 50 years ago to provide a Christian medium education for students in the County Borough of Bridgend.

Archbishop McGrath is a Catholic High School which caters for the religious and educational needs of Catholic children aged 11 – 18. We also welcome children of non-Catholic parents who request the admission of their children because of the religious teaching and the Christian ethos of our school – where there are vacancies.

Students travel from Maesteg, Bridgend, Porthcawl and the Ogmore Valley with a small number travelling from the Vale and further afield. Students are from predominantly English speaking homes. The school's intake is from a varied social background and represents the full range of ability. There were 804 students on roll in September 2017.

The majority of our students have attended the three Catholic feeder primary schools and the local Church in Wales Primary school. The Archbishop cluster Primary schools are Archdeacon John Lewis Brackla, St Mary's and St Patrick's Maesteg, St Robert's Aberkenfig and St Mary's Bridgend.

The school is situated in the residential area of Brackla. The school is easily accessible through excellent transport links. Archbishop McGrath Catholic High School relocated to a new school building in Brackla in September 2011. The school building is designed around children and provides an inspirational environment for pupils to achieve their potential, academically and socially. The innovative design of the school accommodation allows a wide range of learning activities in a mix of indoor and outdoor learning environments. The school has excellent sporting facilities including an all-weather Third Generation pitch.

The new school building was designed by HLM Architects and constructed by Davis Langdon. The school building has won a number of prestigious architectural awards including Buildings Excellence Award in 2012. The pupils are well supported by a progress and wellbeing team made up for each Key Stage of a Key Stage leader, an Assistant Head of Key Stage and a Pastoral Support Officer. One of the school's Assistant Headteachers has been assigned overall responsibility for the progress and wellbeing team including additional learning needs and attendance. In

September 2011, the new school building was awarded the South Wales Police 'Secure by Design' Award.

All visitors sign in at reception on arrival.

A caretaker is in attendance throughout the working day to ensure that toilet and other facilities remain at the highest standard.

The school had a staffing complement of 1 Headteacher, 2, Deputy Headteachers, 2 Assistant Headteachers and 47 Assistant Teachers: 41 full time and 6 part time.
