

Archbishop McGrath Catholic High School A-Level results 2024.



Students in the class of 2024 have embodied our school mission and leave us well-placed to tackle the challenges of life beyond school having secured excellent A-level results exam results.

Headteacher Ashley Howells added 'Huge credit must go to the students but this is also a time to acknowledge and celebrate the support provided by their families during the last seven years. We have a first-class team of staff who ensure our pupils receive the highest levels of academic support and pastoral care. We are delighted that 98% of students in Year 13 achieved 3 or more A-levels with 68% of these achieving grades A*- C.'

Mr. Howells continued 'What these results show is the diverse range of very competitive courses our pupils will be going on to study at university and this reflects the excellent teaching that has been provided by our staff. Yet again, 2024 will see Archbishop McGrath alumni studying a wide range of courses at universities across the country including Oxford, Exeter, Warwick, Cardiff, Swansea, and Bath. Whilst in recent years, exams have been adapted to minimise the impact of the pandemic, it is important to note that the current cohort have not benefitted from any such changes despite having a great deal of disruption earlier in their school careers.'

As well as achieving academic success, Mr. Howells concluded by saying 'equally, if not more important, is the fact that these students leave Archbishop McGrath as well-rounded young adults who have had the benefit of an education underpinned by our strong virtues. This in turn will give them the skills needed to excel in their next chapter. It has been a privilege to have these students as part of our community and they will always be welcome at our school. To our Year 12 students, we congratulate them on achieving positive first steps with their AS level grades. These should provide the motivation needed to achieve further success next year.'
